Dunninger Says Mind Reading Has Drawbacks

HOLLYWOOD (P)—Being a mentalist has its drawbacks, admits Joseph Dunninger, the famed mind reader and magician.

He is here to help mastermind the filming of "Houdini," based rather loosely on the life of the great escape artist.

Dunninger, who was a colleague and friend of Houdini, has performed his mind-reading feats in night clubs and theaters and on radio and television. While this has proved extremely profitable to him, there are other considerations, too.

"For instance," he began, "a few years ago I was to be interviewed by a magazine writer. When she arrived, she didn't ask any questions. She wanted me to guess what she was asking."

"I tried to explain that I could only ascertain certain isolated thoughts, such as her mother's name or a series of digits. We argued about it for half an hour, but she wouldn't give in. Sure enough, the story came out that I had failed to read her mind."

Dunninger's reputation naturally precludes any card play. When he was appearing at a Las Vegas Casino, the management requested that he stay away from the black jack table.

We discussed the current state of the magic business. Dunninger sighed that it is in bad shape. Every other person is an amateur magician, he said, but there are few good professionals. Gone are the Thurons and Houdinis.

"Of the bigtime shows, only Blackstone remains," he remarked, "and he still puts on a good act."

"The trouble is that there are only two big vaudeville houses left—one in Canada and one in New York, the Palace. I think there is a big future for magic in television. But today's youngsters have only a few tricks. Those are expended in one week in TV."

CHATTANOOGA NAMED TO RETIREMENT BOARD

NASHVILLE (P)—Gov. Gordon Browning Tuesday appointed a Chattanooga woman to the board which administers the Tennessee teachers retirement program.

Mrs. J. B. Lauderdale, who succeeds Doyle M. Wallace of Morristown, will serve until March 31, 1953.

Reappointed to the board were V. F. Goddard of Alcoa, for a term ending March 31, 1953; Q. M. Smith of Murfreesboro, for a term ending March 31, 1954; George Johnson of Jackson, for a term ending March 31, 1953; and O. H. Jones of Memphis for a term ending March 31, 1953.

Clement Outlines New Program For Highway Patrol

NASHVILLE (P)—Frank G. Clement, Democratic nominee for governor of Tennessee, said Tuesday he plans to keep state highway patrolmen on the highways.

The Dickson attorney said he has not yet completed his highway safety program, but that "state highway patrol officers will really patrol the highways. There will be an end to the practice of chauffeuring state employees on private errands."

"Officers will be out on the highways instead of in cafes and lunch stands."

Clement outlined some of his plans before leaving by plane for Springfield, Ill., to confer with Gov. Adlai Stevenson.

Clement said he is interested in a program to "elevate the driver licensing system from a mere revenue basis to one promoting public safety."

He added that he is studying recommendations by the National Safety Council that a corps of regional inspectors interview drivers whose performance indicates they are not qualified motor vehicle operators.

The nominee also said he is studying a set of recommendations he will submit to the legislature which would improve conditions in state mental hospitals and prisons.

"Properly administered, our state institutions can do much in rebuilding the minds, character and bodies of unfortunate persons at a reduced per capita cost," he added.

He indicated he would seek to institute "more humane methods" in disciplining incorrigibles.

The nominee said he will end what he described as "negotiated contracts" for highway construction. He defined this as a practice whereby some contractors who have a contract to build a section of road get the contract extended to another section of the project without any additional bidding being required.
