Small Businesses Need More Military Orders, Says Taylor

WASHINGTON (P)-The retiring head of the Small Defense Plants Administration (SDPA), Telford Taylor, reported to President Truman Tuesday that the Pentagon has done far less than it should have done in placing military orders with small companies. Taylor said Secretary of De

fense Lovett has shown a lack of enthusiasm for such placing of contracts, and small firms are getting less than 60 per cent of the defense orders they could handle.

Unless there is an improve ment by the end of the year, he said, the President should ask Congress to give SDPA outright authority to channel certain contracts for small business. At present the agency can use persuasion.
