Marion Davies to Throw
\$25,000 Party for Singer

500 Guests to Attend Affair Given
For Johnny Ray in Beverly Hills

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 1 (AP)—Marion Davies, once movieland's most fabulous hostess, will toss a \$25,000 party tomorrow night for Johnny Ray, a singer she must have heard but never met.

The source gives every indication of being the biggest social affair in Hollywood in years. The acceptance list, numbering 500 already—and growing—reads like pages from the movie almanac.

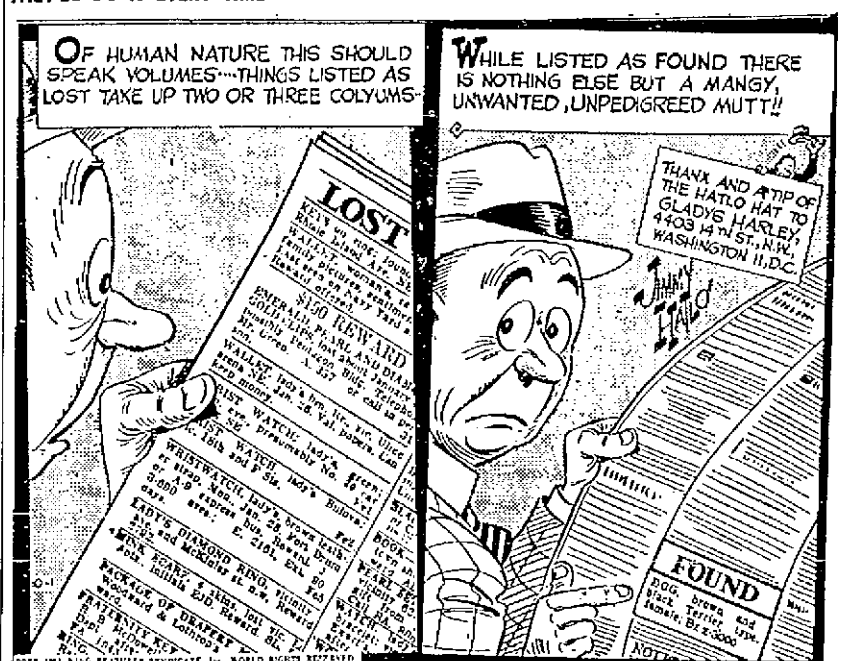
DIME TRUCK

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 1 (INS)—Fifteen personalities from India, who are guests of the U. S. state department, arrive tomorrow and Hollywood is going all out to give them a welcome. According to Director Frank Capra, who has just returned from the Far East, India is second to Hollywood in motion picture production.

Russia has been trying to move in and take over the picture business in India and obviously it's a very wise move on the part of our town to see that it doesn't happen.

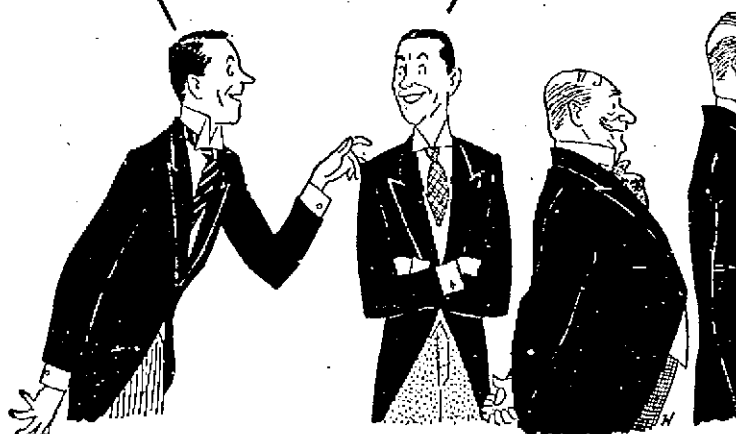
Snapshots of Hollywood collected at random: Peggy Lee underwent minor surgery a few days ago and has been ordered by her doctor to stay in bed for a week.
