Too Much Fluoride Troubles Town

CHESTER, Va. (UP) - While communities around the country are adding fluorides to their water supplies to prevent tooth decay, Chester has a different problem: getting the fluoride out.

There's so much fluoride in the community well that the county health department has to disute the water so it will contain no more than two parts of fluoride to one million parts of water.

A Chester dentist, Lawrence G

Mathews, who advocates water fluoridation himself, was surprised to learn about the situation. Dr. Lawrence said tooth decay among Chester children is "about as bad as anywhere else.'

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
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
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
