Davis Man Finds Thailand A Country Of Contradictions

DAVIS—A land where some people are so poor they can afford to wear only silk clothes, where fish are sometimes killed by automobiles while trying to cross reads, where a species of crab is found 200 miles from the sea, the land that is Asia's rice bowl—Thailand.


These are only some of the unique aspects observed in this ancient, templed nation in southancient, templed hatton in solun-east Asia by Robert W. Munyon, supervisor of the University of California's farm practice pro-gram in which students on the Davis campus of the college of agriculture are able to supple-ment classroom instruction with the practical how to do side of farming. Munyon, recently re-turned to Davis, has been on leave from the university to assist in the work of the Mutual Security Agency in Thailand.

Students Increasing Crops In Thailand, Munyon's work with a team of 25 experts was to study ways in which to increase the agricultural productivity by the use of improved crop varieties, improving soil fertility and the adoption of

mode modern farm practices.

Part of this involved a program of building earth reservoirs in northeast Thailand, an area which long has suffered from lack of water. The water impounded in the reservoirs opened up about 70,000 acres of new land a year to farmers. It is in this area that some of the very poor people wear cheap, locally produced silk instead of more expensivé cotton garments.

"Thailand shows the greatest promise of any nation in the world for increasing its rice pro-duction," Munyon said. "It now duction. is the biggest rice producer out-

side of Communist controlled China." He pointed out, however, that the yield an acre is one of the lowest in the world, the national productivity being relatively high only because a great many acres are under cultivation.

Sought Better Strains

"We attacked the problem of low yields in two ways," said Munyon, "first by selecting and breeding better strains of rice, and second, by demonstrating the use of commercial fertilizer and eron rotation,"

Headquarters for Munyon and his staff were at Kasetert Agri-cultural University in Bangkok. From this center he traveled to experiment stations throughout the country, where he could check field work and coordinate the MSA program with the Thai Ministry of Agriculture.

One of the innovations was the reorganization of the Thai agri-cultural extension service to a pattern similar to that in Cali-fornia. In these travels Munyon learned of the amphibious perch which crosses reads in going from one invested rice field to which crosses reads in going from one inundated rice field to another. Some of these fields are under water for much of the year and harvesting is done from boats. boats.

Tree Crown Gall Can Be Controlled

VISALIA, Tulare Co. - Farm Adviser John H. Foott of Tulare County says crown gall is caused by a bacteria in the soil, which enters the plant tissue and enters the plant tissue and causes a cancer type growth. The growth can be found below or above ground. The galls are quite obvious because of their growth. Foott adds:

Foott adds: This disease is found on most species of fruits and nuts. Some rootstocks are mere suseptible than others, This should be taken

into consideration when choosing a rootstock for your orchard.

There is a control of the disease. The use of a mix of one part of Elgetel to four parts of alcohol is used to kill the crown gall organism. The treatment is simple and can be applied at any time of the year,
