25 Writers, Producers, Directors Recieve Christopher Awards

NEW YORK — Two newspaper columns, two magazine articles, two books, two new motion pictures, three special telecasts for Christmas and two radio programs have been selected for quarterly Christopher awards as creative works that "reflect the power for good can be exerted, with God's help, by one individual in the literary and entertainment fields."

The 25 writers, producers and directors designated to receive bronze medallions, as announced by Father James Keller, founder and director of the Christophers, at a luncheon at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel here were:

In the newspaper field, awards were presented to Bob Considine, of International News Service, for his December 20th column syndicated by King Features, "Symbol of Life Missing," and to Anne O'Hare McCormick for her New York Times column of December 24th, "The Night Before Christmas."

In the magazine field, Christopher medallions went to Ernest O. Hauser for "The Christian Conqueror of a Red City," which appeared in the Saturday Evening Post on November 15th, the story of how the ascetic mayor of Florence was able to wrest control of the ancient Italian city from a powerfully entrenched Communist group.

Also, an award to Dorothy Thompson's "A Reason to Live and a Reason to Die," an article providing an unusual pinpointing of the spiritual purpose of both life and death, which appeared in the Reader's Digest of January and was adapted from an article appearing in the October 1952 issue of the Ladies Home Journal.

In the literary field an award was made to H. F. M. Prescott's best seller, "The Man on a Donkey." The work, which was published by the MacMillan Company, is a chronicle of the faith of the six persons who led one of the most inspiring crusades in history during the reign of Henry VIII.

Also, an award to Clare Booth Luce for her "Saints For Now," published by Sheed and Ward. The work illustrates what the
