

Looking and Listening

By JEREMY GAIGE EDWARD R. MURROW'S distinguished series of television broadcasts, See It Now, will make its appearance over WHEN tonight at 10:30, and will be seen every other Tuesday at this time.

These news documentaries have received great praise from Jack Gould of the New York Times, Variety Magazine, and John Crosby of the Herald Tribune. To quote Crosby in yesterday's paper: "The case of Lt. Milo J. Radulovich is now pretty well closed. I think it's fairly safe to say that it would never have been opened at all without the intervention of Edward R. Murrow, who gave it national prominence on See It Now."

"Murrow is rapidly becoming the St. George of television, the only man who dares to tackle controversial subjects, and just about the only guy who can get away with it."

The trade paper Variety said of this same program: "TV expressed itself eloquently last night when Ed Murrow on his See It Now translated the half-hour into one of video's most persuasive, forceful editorials. Murrow and coproducer Fred Friendly demonstrated beyond doubt TV's impact on the American populace. See It Now's presentation of the case of Lieutenant Radulovich, as such, was a milestone in the realm of pictorial editorialization which brought to the TV medium a new-found respect."

Such is the caliber and stature of the program called See It Now over WHEN tonight at 10:30.

JERRY WALLECK, a Polish-American framed by a former boss on a narcotics charge, awaits deportation to the land he left as an infant in "The Alien" on the Fireside Theater tonight at 9 over WSYR-TV.

Only at the moment of his deportation does Jerry realize how much his country means to him, and he is moved to attempt an escape to Canada. A chance encounter with a small child leads to a sudden change of plans.

SINGER DICK HAYMES will make his second appearance on Suspense tonight at 9:30 over WHEN. Haymes plays a kindly young man who believes a girl's story that she is marked for murder, and risks his life to save her, despite warnings from friends that she is a habitual liar and thrill-seeker. The drama is entitled "Laugh It Off."

Producer Vinton Freedley, columnist Hy Gardner and jazz authority Leonard Feather will be Fred Allen's show business experts on Judge for Yourself tonight at 10 over WSYR-TV.

MY FRIEND IRMA, starring Marie Wilson as the incredible, irrepressible white collar girl whom antics on and off the job have delighted many radio listeners since 1947, returns to the air tonight at 9:30 over WFBL.

THE CIRCLE THEATER presents "A Little Morning to Sell," the drama of a top Hollywood star who realizes his greatest triumph off-screen, tonight at 9:30 over WSYR-TV.

A young man with a police record is framed by a ruthless racketeer and is left with only the love of his girl friend standing between him and the death penalty in "Ghost of a Chance" on Barrie Crank, Confidential Investigator, tonight at 8:30 over WSYR radio.

DETECTIVE Sgt. Joe Friday and his partner Frank Smith, trail a gang of hijackers who have already stolen 14 loaded trucks, on Dragnet tonight at 9 over WSYR radio.

The police officer, with virtually no clue to the identity of the culprits, interview a victim who had been kidnaped and beaten. The driver turns up a bit of evidence, a few chips of paint.

This bare clue, and the persistent probing of Friday and Smith in cooperation with the crime laboratory, lead to the first break in the case.




