Property owners had been notified by mail of the hearing, which was required before costs of the work can be assessed.

Streets paved were: East Clark street, from Bridge to Babcock avenues; North Newton avenue, from Clark to the north avenue, from Clark to the north end of Newton; Sunset street, from Lakeview boulevard to the city limits, and Stanley avenue, from Sunset to the city limits.

Eight-inch paving was laid on Clark street and Newton avenue. Paving on Sunset and Stanley was six-inch.

The total cost of the four jobs was \$54,663.36. The city's share—

Property owners will pay the balance — \$42,465.60. The assessable figure is nearly \$7.000 less than the cost estimated by the city engineer.


