

Paving Jobs Reviewed by City Council

The city council held a hearing last night on four paving jobs completed last fall, but heard no complaints.

Property owners had been notified by mail of the hearing, which was required before costs of the work can be assessed.

Streets paved were:

East Clark street, from Bridge to Babcock avenues; North Newton avenue, from Clark to the north end of Newton; Sunset street, from Lakeview boulevard to the city limits, and Stanley avenue, from Sunset to the city limits.

Eight-inch paving was laid on Clark street and Newton avenue. Paving on Sunset and Stanley was six-inch.

City Manager said costs per front foot were:

Clark street, (residential), \$8.29, and (commercial), \$11.86 and \$12.89.

Newton avenue, (commercial), \$12.23 and \$12.35.

Sunset street, (residential), \$9.60.

Stanley avenue, (residential), \$5.85.

The total cost of the four jobs was \$54,663.36. The city's share — it pays for paving at intersections and storm sewers — was \$12,197.76.

Property owners will pay the balance — \$42,465.60. The assessable figure is nearly 37,000 less than the cost estimated by the city engineer.

New Ulm Area Attorneys OK Newspaper Ads

NEW ULM, Minn. (AP)—Attorneys in the ninth judicial district bar association went on record Saturday as favoring publication of their professional cards in newspapers.

These cards were simple advertisements listing the name of the lawyer, address and telephone numbers, and generally are run in a directory in weekly or smaller daily newspapers.

Last year, the Minnesota Bar Association accepted the ruling of the American Bar Association that these cards violate the code of ethics. Many lawyers in Minnesota since then have removed their cards.

On a unanimous vote here it was decided to ask the next state bar convention to permit judicial districts to make the decision on cards.

Moscow Protests NATO Defend Plans

MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet government has protested formally for the third time within a week against defense plans of a North Atlantic Pact nation.

The latest Kremlin note went Sunday to Greece, charging that U. S. military bases on Greek territory threaten peace in the Balkans.

Russia protested to the Netherlands last Thursday against establishment of a U. S. military air base on Dutch territory and also to Turkey against the mutual security pact she is negotiating with Pakistan.

Salk Polio Vaccine Available for Trial

NEW YORK (AP)—Enough commercially manufactured trial vaccine to inoculate more than 370,000 children will be available for the polio field tests about April 12, it was announced Monday.

Dr. Hart E. Van Patten, medical director of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, made the statement in a "status report" to all state health officers.

After April 12, he added, "vaccine will be coming forth at a continuous rate to enable us to move rapidly toward the completion of the field trials which will include between 500,000 and one million school children in the first three elementary grades."

The vaccine to be used will be that developed by Dr. Jonas E. Salk, of the University of Pittsburgh, under a grant from the National Foundation.

Van Patten said 44 states already have indicated their desire to participate in the trials.
