

# Small Fry Hold Own Big Rodeo

HALLETTSVILLE, June 4 — (AP) —Boots and saddles! Lariats and spurs!

On June 16-17-18, the small fry of Texas hold their own rodeo. Gov. Beauford H. Jester will lead their parade.

For the third consecutive year, the High School State Championship Rodeo will bring youngsters from all over Texas to Hallettsville to compete in calf roping, tie-down, bareback bronc riding and bulldogging. Even the girls take part. They compete in the cutting horse contest.

New Idea

The idea to feature youngsters of high school age was hatched one night three years ago while three men sat talking on the Hallettsville courthouse square. Nothing like it had been organized before in any of the other states and it seemed a good idea.

Since that first rodeo for boys and girls in 1947, five states have followed with their own. El Paso, Okla.; Sulphur, La.; New Underwood, S. D.; and Montana, all have had contests featuring teenagers.

Rules here are strict. Only students in good scholastic standing who did not graduate before May 1 of this year have been allowed to enroll in this year's rodeo. It is Texans only, but students from at least nine other states have written, pleading for a chance to participate.

Pete McKenzie, ranch-owner and cattleman, for the third year will act as the rodeo announcer.

The youngster who displays the highest sense of sportsmanship during the rodeo will receive from the National Quarter Horse Breeders' Association an engraved Gladys Brown statue of a champion quarter horse. And the American Quarter Horse Association has a quarter horse statuette for the cowboy with the best-trained horse.

There are many other prizes, ranging from Mano Milos of Mexico and Fred Nauhaus of Houston to expensive star-embossed boots, elaborately stamped saddles and gold and silver belt buckles from the Hallettsville chamber of commerce.

"Scooter" Fries of Bandera, Tex., will participate in the rodeo again this year. Scooter is 16. He won the roping contest last year. He has thrown 17 loops in competition in the last two championship roping deos and has never missed a loop. With three more years in which to compete, Scooter is a major threat.

# Daniel Carries Fight Over Laguna Madre Ownership To The Court Of Public Opinion

AUSTIN, June 4 — Attorney Gen. Price Daniel has appealed to public opinion in a legislative fight which involves millions of dollars worth of oil and gas.

The fight also involves the Kennedy Ranch Co., one of the state's largest ranches, Humble Oil & Refining Co., the state's largest oil company, and title to a large stretch of Laguna Madre. Owners of land in Kennedy County and Padre Island are contending that all of Laguna Madre between Padre and the mainland is really mainland or island. Part of the area claimed is that through which the Intracoastal Canal passes.

Change of Venue

The battle of the titans came out in the open when Daniel wrote members of the Senate, asking them to pass House Bill 753. It would change venue on cases involving title to submerged lands in Travis County (Austin). Present law requires that they be tried in the county where the land lies.

The bill passed the House of Representatives several weeks ago, by a unanimous vote. But last week the Senate voted, 14-13, against considering it when Sen. Fred Harris of Dallas tried to bring it up for action.

The simple little bill involves title to the land in Laguna Madre. Daniel, as a member of the State School Land Board, claims that it is submerged land belonging to the permanent school fund. Humble, which holds the lease on the Kennedy Ranch, claims that 56,447 acres of it is part of the mainland, and therefore part of the Kennedy Ranch. This acreage brought the school fund cash bonuses totalling \$1,788,158 when it was put up for lease.

Padre Claim

E. S. J. Whitehead of San Antonio and his associates, who own Padre Island in this area, are claiming that the remaining 19,539 acres of Laguna Madre are now a part of Padre Island. Cash bonuses paid for leases on this area totalled \$832,669. Cash bonus bids of this size indicate that the oil companies think the area contains many times that much oil, and gas.

The natural thing to do in such a case would be to try the case in court. But Daniel has hesitated to do that, since the present law requires that such cases be tried in

the county where the land lies, in this case Kennedy County.

Lieut. Allan Shivers, the presiding officer of the Senate. Two weeks ago, when Sen. Harris tried to bring the bill up during an unopposed session, Shivers refused to recognize him, on the ground that the bill was controversial.

Unusual Move

Daniel's public advocacy of the bill is unusual, in that State officials ordinarily stay pretty quiet on legislative matters. But, after working quietly for weeks, Daniel finally wrote the letter to the senators, and made the letter public to rally public opinion on his side.
