Notes On Programs Coming Up Tonight

TWO CBS dramatic shows, "Broadway Is My Beat," and "Escape," will return to the air tonight as summer replacement shows.

"Broadway," recounting the adventures of a tough but sentimental New York detective, will be heard at 8 p.m. over WPAY. Starring as Detective Danny Clover is Anthony Ross, who has worked both as radio announcer and actor during the last five years. The detective series had its premiere over CBS in February this year, when it was a Sunday feature.

"Escape," which presents well-known mystery and adventure stories will go in at 9 p.m. The program features stories adapted for radio and corresponding to the "Suspense" show for which it is the summer replacement.

Other mystery shows on the Thursday night lineup are "Counter-Spy" at 7 p.m., and "Mr. Keen, Tracer of Lost Persons" at 8:30. David Harding and his associates will crack another racket during the "Counter-Spy" episode, while Mr. Keen will solve "The Silver Locket Murder Case." Bennett Kilpack stars as "Mr. Keen."

For music lovers WPAY will present "Through The Listening Glass," a weekly half-hour musical feature at 9:30 p.m. presided over by John Michaels. The program will include the piano playing of Evelyn Tyner and Jack Shaindlin with his "Silver Strings" orchestra.

Miss Tyner will offer "Medley of Nursery Rhymes," "Londoner's Air," "Song of India." The Silver Strings will play "The Swan," "Starlight Serenade" and "Strauss Autograph Waltzes." "Some Folks" by Stephen Foster will be sung by the Lang-Worth Chorus.

Also along the musical line will be Mutual's "This Is Paris" program.

Hours are Portsmouth time (Eastern standard). Erroneous listings, if any, are due to last-minute changes by stations and networks.

Police File Request For Two Cruisers, Four Motorcycles

Purchase of two cruisers and four motorcycles was requested of the city manager's office today by the police department.

Police Chief Hughie Rudity said he has sent the requisition to the office of Acting Manager Charles S. Stevenson for the replacement of motor equipment which has been worn out in several years of service. The last sedans purchased for cruiser service were 1948 and 1947 models. The cycles now in use by traffic patrolmen are all nearly nine years old.

Mr. Stevenson said the purchases probably would be made as funds for the equipment were earmarked informally when the 1949 city budget was prepared.

New equipment for the police department was a major consideration during the campaign for the 2-mill levy last fall.

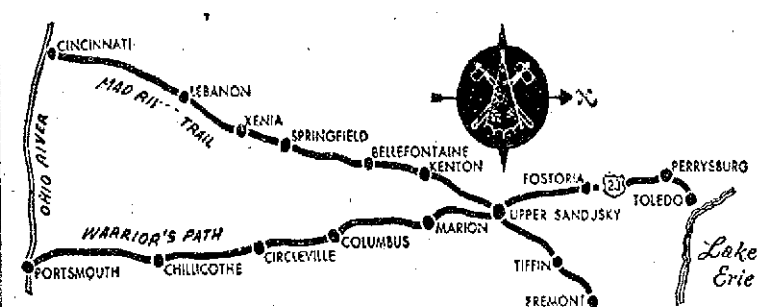
Takes Over Bus Line

Retracing Trails:

'Warrior Path' Once Crossed Ohio



IN RE-EXPLORING Ohio this summer along the ancient Indian trails, Boy Scouts and nature lovers can visit the historic scenes and enjoy the state forests and parks that were favorite spots of the Mound Builders, Indian tribes and early pioneers.

Across Ohio from Cincinnati to Fremont the early Indians' moccasined feet wore the Mad River Trail and from Portsmouth to Toledo the Warrior's Path. Both of these trails that were later followed by the military expeditions that opened up the Ohio Country are today followed and paralleled by modern highways for the convenience of motorists.

The Mad River Trail starts at Cincinnati and can be followed over Route 42 through Lebanon and Xenia; Route 68 through Springfield, Urbana, Bellefontaine, and Kenton; Route 87 to Upper Sandusky; and Route 53 through Tiffin to Fremont where the Mad River Trail joined the Great Trail and the Lake Trail of the Indians.

The Warrior's Path can be followed today up the Scioto River valley from Portsmouth and on to Toledo over Route 23, through some of the most interesting country in the state.

Cradled among the hills along the Scioto are many of the extensive works of the Mound Builders whose empire seemed to center here. This is also the route of one of Ohio's earliest roads.

State parks and state forests are scattered along Route 23 for the enjoyment of hikers, campers, nature lovers, picnickers, and motorists.

13 Defects Found In Safety Check Of Cars

MARATHON, July 7—Thirteen cars have been found with defects in the annual check of motor vehicles conducted at the sheriff's office here.

Sheriff William Brown and Deputy R. W. Weese are assisting the state patrol in examining headlights, rear lights, horns, windshields and windshield wipers, dim switch, registration cards, driver's license and brakes. All

cars checked are given a red sticker to indicate the check.

Ten of the 13 cars with defects had defective stop lights, while two had defective brakes and one had tires too thin for highway operation.
