WPAY-CBS and NBC will be in opposite moods tonight with two programs bowing out on WPAY and the same number premiering on NBC.

"Broadway Is My Beat", featuring the adventures of Detective Danny Clover, will give way next week to "FBI in Peace and War" at 8 p.m., WPAY.

"Evening Primrose" is the story to be dramatized on "Escape", at 9 p.m., same station. This tale originally was scheduled for an earlier date. It is the yarn of a poet who decides to live in a department store, hiding during the day, and finds a whole community living the same way. Next week "Suspense" will return to the 9 p.m. slot, with Gregory Peck starring in "Nightmare" for the first broadcast.

Dominican Arms Plant Established

Concern Set Up By Hungarians May Produce Trouble

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25.—(NEA)—It can now be revealed that for the past year, Hungarian nationals have been active in setting up a secret, \$6,000,000 small arms and machine gun manufacturing plant in the Dominican Republic. This is Dictator Rafael Trujillo's little country which, with Haiti, shares the Caribbean island between Cuba and Puerto Rico.

There has been no previous news about this new arms plant in the Western Hemisphere. But the successful establishment of this factory by European nationals in 1948 may set the pattern for further enterprises of the same sort. And this has an important bearing on the \$1,450,000,000 military assistance program now before Congress.

Latins Could Get Arms
Ninety-five percent of this arms aid would go to Old World countries. But there is one item of \$100,000,000 which has particular interest to Latin-America. This is section 8-C of the bill, which would authorize the U.S. armed services to order and buy American-made arms for foreign governments.

These arms would be paid for by the foreign governments, on delivery. All the arms aid bill would do is provide a kind of revolving fund and credit to finance their manufacture.

The importance of this section of the law to the United States is that it would insure the use of American-made arms in Latin-America. It would be a move towards standardization of arms in the Western Hemisphere.

Before World War II, most Latin-American countries used European arms. This was a cause of considerable trouble to the U.S. in combating Fascism and Nazism in the Western Hemisphere.

Latins Got Weapons From Axis
Peru was slanted toward Italy when it bought arms from Mussolini. Bolivia was slanted towards the Nazis when it bought German arms and had German military advisers.

Up to three-fourths of the arsenal machinery and equipment used in the Argentine, Chile, Brazil, and many of the smaller republics, were of German or other European makes. European citizens were usually hired to set up these plants. They remained to operate them for the various governments.

During World War II, American lend-lease arms began to supplant this equipment. Sales of U.S. surplus arms have furthered the replacement. U.S. military missions now are accredited to most Latin-American republics. But if a Hungarian arms plant is now to be put in full operation in the Dominican Republic, it may lead to many international complications and make more difficult the keeping of peace in an already troubled area.

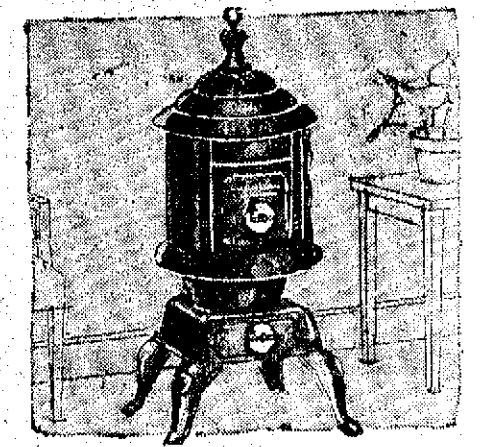

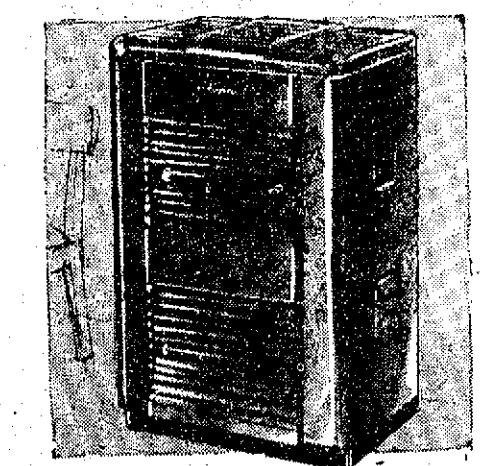

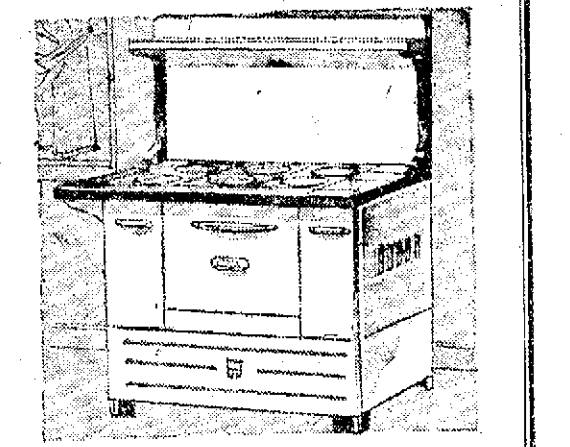
