

Gambler Freed By Error Is Back

A convicted Charleston gambler, released from Kanawha County jail 43 days before expiration of his sentence, went into voluntary custody yesterday to finish out his term, the sheriff's office reported.

The prisoner was identified as 31-year-old Albert Kerns of 834 Bigley Av., sentenced May 28 to six months' confinement and fined

\$300 on a conviction of illegal operation of gaming tables.

Sheriff Carson Richards blamed the premature release on a clerical error stemming from a misunderstanding over when Kerns' sentence was to begin.

Kerns, a jail trusty, began serving his sentence July 2, after more than a month's stay pending an appeal. He was to have been released Dec. 2.

Kerns returned to jail after he was informed by members of his family he was being sought, Sheriff Richards said.

Operations to widen the Kanawha River channel at London Locks and Paint Creek shoal will begin Monday.

The U. S. corps of engineers at Huntington warned navigators that the right side of the channel below London Locks will be widened from the end of the guide wall to approximately 1,000 feet downstream.

At Paint Creek shoal the channel will be widened on the left side. All spoil will be deposited on the left bank opposite old Lock No. 1.

The work will take about six weeks.

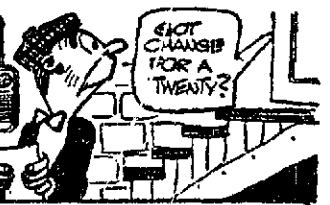
