

### Gambler Freed By Error Is Back

A convicted Charleston gambler, released from Kanawha County jail 43 days before expiration of his sentence, went into voluntary custody yesterday to finish out his term, the sheriff's office reported.

The prisoner was identified as 31-year-old Albert Kerns of 834 Bigley Av., sentenced May 28 to six months' confinement and fined \$300 on a conviction of illegal operation of gaming tables.

Sheriff Carson Richards blamed the premature release on a clerical error stemming from a misunderstanding over when Kerns' sentence was to begin.

Kerns, a jail trustee, began serving his sentence July 2, after more than a month's stay pending an appeal. He was to have been released Dec. 2.

Kerns returned to jail after he was informed by members of his family he was being sought, Sheriff Richards said.
