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3 Injured in Blast; Damage Put at \$50,000

MILWAUKEE—(AP)—Three men were injured and \$50,000 damage caused Monday in an explosion and fire at the city sewage disposal plant on Jones island.

Chief Engineer Raymond Leary said the blast possibly was caused by leaking illuminating gas or manganite dust, a fertilizer by-product of the sewage plant.

The explosion blew a hole in the roof of the dryer house, shattered windows, damaged equipment, and touched off about 100 small fires according to firemen.

The blast, in the three-story brick and steel dryer house, occurred in the cyclone stack, a chimney above one of the 10 dryers.

It set off a chain reaction in the other dryers, connected by ducts. The injured men were working in the building. None was hurt seriously.

Leary said the disposal plant has a reserve capacity, and that it would not be necessary to shut down while repairs were being made.

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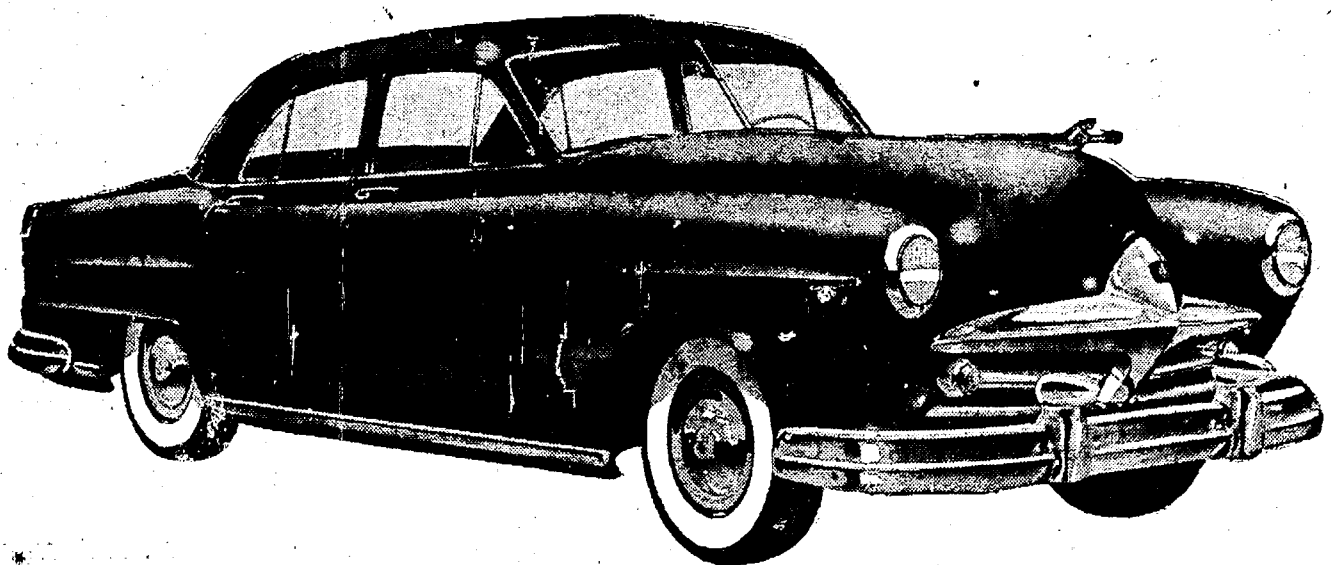
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
