Fight Over Delegates Looms As GOP Convention Feature Taft Arrives in Chicago to Take Charge of Drive; Ike Enjoys Day of Rest

CHICAGO, June 30 (AP)—Preliminaries to the Republican national convention started today with a fight over contested delegates shaping up as the main event prior to next Monday's big political show.
Sen. Robert A. Taft, one of the chief candidates for the presidential nomination, was in Chicago to take charge of the final week in his campaign. He arrived from Washington by plane early today.

Representatives of the Ohio senator and Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, his chief rival for the nomination, met last night with Guy G. Gabrielson, GOP national chairman, to discuss rules and procedures for settling contests over seating disputed delegations.

Meeting Planned
Another meeting was planned today. But the sessions are a preliminary to the expected showdown fight scheduled to start tomorrow when the national committee begins to hear contests.

The contests involve convention votes from eight states and Puerto Rico. The sharpest fight is expected to revolve around Texas' 38 disputed seats. Other delegations involved in state contests and votes are Florida with 18; Louisiana with six; Georgia and Mississippi, each with four, and Missouri and Kansas with one each.

In each contest, there are two sets of delegates seeking recognition, one group backing Taft and the other Eisenhower.

Speech Ready

The keynote speech at Monday night's session by Gen. Douglas A. MacArthur has been written, Gabrielson said. He added "on one who is out in front for either principle candidate" has seen it. He said the speech had been checked by responsible party leaders, whom he did not name.

MacArthur is expected to speak for 30 to 40 minutes.

As the campaign headed into the final week, Taft and Eisenhower forces directed their operations only two floors apart in the convention headquarters hotel, the Conrad Hilton.

Campaign managers of both candidates fired new verbal blasts. Sen. Lodge said in a statement that "Taft and his advisers are resorting to desperate last-minute political tricks to thwart the will of the rank and file of the Republican party."

Taft's campaign manager, David S. Ingalls said in a statement that "nothing could be more ridiculous than Sen. Lodge's extravagant claim that Gen. Eisenhower is a stronger candidate than Sen. Taft."

The resolutions committee of the convention will meet unofficially tomorrow to begin drafting a Republican platform.

Representing Taft at meetings with Gabrielson were Monte Appel of Washington, J. Kenneth Bradley of Bridgeport, Conn., and Rep. Clarence J. Brown of Ohio.

Eisenhower, who is due in Chicago from Denver Saturday, was represented by Sinclair Weeks, national committeeman from Massachusetts, William P. Rogers of Washington and Ralph G. Boyd of Boston.

Taft expected to stay in Chicago until Thursday, when he
