CATTLE CLATTER

The black-eye pea crop in the Dilley section, as in a number of other South Texas communities, has been an important cash crop this year.

Comments O. E. Hugo, Dilley stock farmer. Several thousand acres were planted to the peas in Frio County this year and the crop has been extremely good, he states. Farmers have been netting around two cents per pound on the crop and a majority of the fields have been yielding an average of 1,000 pounds per acre of the green peas on the first picking. Hugo harvested around 60,000 pounds from a 45-acre field on the first picking. Farmers, he explains, get a "four-way deal" out of the peas: Green peas, dried peas, a grazing crop and then a soil-improvement crop.

Lack of rains during the winter months the past three years has hurt farming and ranching more than anything else, comments Johnnie Schmidt, Converse stock farmer. "We haven't been able to get the rains in the winter and it's that moisture that determines whether we make a crop next year or not," said Schmidt. He stated that "we will make some corn and feed but the crops aren't near as good as if we had received rain when we needed it."

WASHINGTON, July 4.—The Senate Public Works Committee has approved a House-passed bill extending until June 30, 1956, the Water Pollution Control Act. It now is due to expire June 30, 1953.

The act authorizes the United States public health service to develop water pollution control programs in cooperation with the states.

Seniority Bill Okayed

WASHINGTON, July 4.—Congress has passed a bill to restore to federal employees of Japanese ancestry the seniority and time in grade they lost during World War II as a result of security measures against Japanese-Americans. The legislation affects about 200 federal employees.
