State Offers Free Trees For Planting On Strip Banks

John Wilson, chief forester for the Moshannon District of the state's Department of Forests and Waters, today reminded persons owning land which was stripped of coal before June 1, 1945, that the state will plant small trees on the spoil banks free of charge.

The work is done through the department's Reclamation Fund. The fund is maintained annually through a filing fee paid by coal strippers for new operations throughout the state.

A state law which became effective June 1, 1945 requires strippers to post a bond for each acre to be stripped to guarantee leveling and reforestation of spoil banks.

Through the Reclamation Fund the state has been planting seedlings on spoil banks which came into existence before that law.

Mr. Wilson said there will be sufficient trees to plant about 500 acres this spring if the acreage can be located.

Any landowner having stripped land under this category desiring it planted may contact Mr. Wilson at Forests and Waters office in the Keystone building, Clearfield. He emphasized, however, that the property owners must grant permission for such planting and must agree that it be for reforestation and not mere landscaping.

The department forces have planted about 600 acres in Clearfield county and Rush township of Centre county since the work started in 1949. The project includes planting only, not leveling.
