TEHACHAPI, July 26. (49) Aft ershocks from Monday's big earthquake continue to shake Southern California with the latest causing some damage but no casualties.

A series of three shocks yes terday, one of them equal in intensity to the 1933 Long Beach disaster, caused two landslides in the Caliente Creek area 35 miles east of Bakersfield.

One slide badly damaged a pickup truck in which three men were riding, but they escaped in jury. Two houses in the area were damaged. Sheriff's deputies evacuated four persons from their homes.

The aftershocks were felt in Los Angeles and caused a rattling of dishes and swinging chande-liers. The first shock came at 6:14 a. m. (P.d.t.), the second at 12:10 p. m. and the third at 12:44. jolts loosened bricks in damaged buildings at Arvin and Tehachapi, towns that bore the brunt of Monday's temblor which took 12 lives. The Portland Cement Co., which employes more than 300 persons closed its plant at Monolith, Plant officials said they feared the ad ditional shaking might have in-creased damage to the plant.
