Candy Matson, YUkon 2-8209. July 7, 1949. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "Murder On A Cable Car". Sustaining. The man riding next to Candy on a cable car is silently shot to death. Candy Matson, YUkon 2-8209. November 10, 1949. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "The Devil In The Deep Freeze". Sustaining. Candy Matson, YUkon 2-8209. June 20, 1950. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "Symphony Of Death". Sustaining. YUkon 2-8309. A composer is going to die, and there's no doubt about it. Natalie Masters. 1/2 hour.

Candy Matson, YUkon 2-8209. September 11, 1950. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "The Movie Company". Sustaining. Candy finds a real body hanging among the props on a movie set. Natalie Masters. 25 minutes.

Candy Matson, YUkon 2-8209. October 9, 1950. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "The Ford Ord Story" Sustaining. Candy is invited to an army dance at Fort Ord and solves a double murder in the process. Natalie Masters. 1/2 hour.

Candy Matson, YUkon 2-8209. October 23, 1950. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "The Egyptian Armulet" Sustaining. Candy solves a murder case involving a strange Egyptian amulet. Candy Matson, YUkon 3-8309. NBC net, San Francisco origination. "The Fortune Teller". Sustaining. Industrialist Allison Gray is missing, and the stars tell Candy that an astrologer is involved. The phone number is announced as being the one above. The phone number is different on other broadcasts. Possibly an audition.
