Research Log:

The Crime Club aired on the Mutual Broadcasting System as a half-hour weekly radio series, beginning on December 2, 1946 and continuing until October 16, 1947, a run of 47 episodes. It aired on Mondays at 8 p.m. through December and then on Thursdays at 10 p.m. It was also heard on Wednesdays and Sundays on some stations.

Each installment was introduced by the series host, The Librarian, portrayed by Barry Thomson and Raymond Edward Johnson (who was perhaps better known as the host of *Inner Sanctum Mysteries*). The series featured murder and mystery dramas, some of which had already been published by the Doubleday Crime Club. A new Crime Club book was made available to the public each week and distributed though local newsstands and bookstores.

Each show in the series began the same way. The telephone rings and the Librarian answers "Hello, I hope I haven't kept you waiting. Yes, this is the Crime Club. I'm the Librarian. (*name of the program*)? Yes, we have that *Crime Club* story for you. Come right over. (The organist plays a creepy tune). The doorbell chimes. "Ah you're here. Good. Take the easy chair by the window. Comfortable? The book is on this shelf." (The organist plays a scary chord). Here it is - (*name of the program, the author and a very brief summary*). "Let's look at it under the reading lamp." The Librarian begins reading the prologue for the tale, and another *Crime Club* offering begins.

Barry Thompson and Raymond E. Johnson played the mild-mannered, albeit ominous, Librarian.

Roger Bower produced and directed most of the episodes. Stedman Coles and Wyllis Cooper (*Lights Out, Quiet Please*) did most of the scripts, adapted from the Crime Club books.

Using This Document – Conventions:

- Series Name for this work will be under the umbrella of Crime Club.
- Network Affiliation is MUTUAL for the duration of the series and will not be identified in each episode.
- Sponsored by: All episodes are sustained by the Mutual Network.
- <u>First Line:</u> The first spoken dramatic line of the available recordings. For this series, usually 10 or more words are transcribed for each episode.
- <u>Plot:</u> provides a brief subjective description of the plot highlights.
- Credits: Listed from the announced cast and crew plus other sources when available.
- <u>End of Show:</u> items include information provided by the performers or announcers or a public service announcement (PSA) beyond the end of the drama. This is usually where the next episode is announced.
- <u>Comment:</u> is used to denote various details about the episode or issues that can't be resolved from current research.
- Title line and other information for episodes that are NOT AVAILABLE will be boxed as this example.
- The left margin column is used for broadcast play dates. Followed by assigned episode numbers when available. Other left margin markers are EPS, which identifies changes in Episode broadcast information.

<u>End of Show:</u> Next week's show will be *For the Hangman*. A new Crime Club book is available at newsstands now. This program came to you from New York. Mutual's Mystery Hour continues immediately after station identification with the Casebook of Gregory Hood. This is the Mutual Broadcasting System.

<u>Audio Quality:</u> The first ten seconds of the program opening have been deleted. 64/44 version: File starts with a MS Windows system sound, which could be removed without loss of program content. More surface noise than the 32/22, although not greatly objectionable, and an unfortunate "hissing" throughout, indicative of slightly overaggressive noise reduction. Same scratch from 06:00 to 13:00 as the 32/22 version.

32/22 version: Generally, much more listenable than the 64/44 version. Virtually no surface noise apparent, save for a scratch on the disc between about 06:00 and 13:00. No evidence of aggressive noise reduction; overall, much less fatiguing to listen to than the 64/44. Slightly less "bright" sounding than the other version, but in my view not enough to make a difference. The near-lack of surface noise and the absence of noise-reduction artifacts make this version preferable, despite the lower bit rate. This version is also about :20 longer than the 64/44, but I can't account for the difference--I couldn't discern a difference in pitch which would explain it. Program content appears to be identical between versions.

In my opinion, the 32/22 version is preferable to the 64/44. The 32/22 is OK for release.

<u>First Line:</u> (Sound of telephone ringing). [1st voice] "Yes, Inspector McKee speaking. Homicide". [2nd voice] Yes, I was just going to talk to you about that".

<u>Plot:</u> Inspector McKee receives a call from Gilbert Shannon, telling him to come to his apartment where he will find a murder scene. Moments later, Shannon's daughter calls McKee to report finding her father's body. McKee, mystified, then begins an investigation into the death of the corpse who called in his own murder.
