TALL BLONDE, soprano Dorothy Kirtland, who has been singing on NBC's Music Hall (WSYR, 9 tonight) is a prima donna in the comparatively new tradition of opera stars who can dance and act as well as sing.

She's beautiful, too. A native of Montreal, N. J., Miss Kirtland comes from a musical family.

Her grandfather, James J. Beggs, had been conductor of the famous Buffalo Bill Band which toured the world, a great-aunt, Catherine Hayes, had sung in opera in Europe and all members of her immediate family were musicians.

In childhood, even before her voice began to develop, she was given dramatic and dancing lessons. Then vocal instruction was added. Her first radio success was on the Postal Telegraph program in New York followed.

Dorothy sailed for Italy for study in March, 1939, but had to return shortly thereafter because of the war. She made her American concert debut the following summer at the Court of Peace of the New York World's Fair.

Miss Kirtland joined the Chicago Civic Opera Company that Fall and became a star with the New York City Center Opera Company about four years later. She has sung on many major radio programs and has appeared on concert stages throughout the country, including Syracuse. Now a Metropolitan Opera star, she has sung also in a number of operettas.

MARGARET WHITING, long a top flight songstress, who left the CBS Club 15 program after her marriage, will join the cast of the CBS Jack Smith Show when the program resumes Aug. 22. She replaces Martha Tilton in the Monday and Friday spots. Miss Tilton currently is featured on the Monday through Friday CBS Curt Massey show (WFLA, 5:45).
