1. USUAL TX OPENING

- 2. TWO MEN LAUGH BOISTROUSLY!
- 3. COLOMBO: (STILL LAUGHING) These brave men who risk their very existences
- 4. sailing out for the new world! (LAUGHING)
- 5. RODREGAS: (LAUGHING) Si! These brave souls who may never again have
- 6. the benifit of our great civilization! But in the name of thier
- 7. dear Portugal, they give up all.... (DRAMATICALLY) and go!
- 8. BOTH ROAR WITH LAUGHTER AGAIN
- 9. COLOMBO: Abbbbbbb, Rodregas, we are of all men most fortunate!
- 10. RODERGAS: Si. What luxury! What bliss! Here we are, in the New World
- 11. slaves to do our bidding ... treasure enough to buy the whole
- 12. country of Portugal.
- 13. COLOMBO: But who would, for all the treasure in the new and old world,
- 14. leave the paradise we have here?
- 15. RODREGAS: Not I, my friend.
- 16. COLOMBO: (STARTS TO CHUCKLE) What did you think of my method of hiding
- 17. the treasure?
- 18. RODREGAS: A stroke of nothing short of genius! These stupid natives know
- 19. nothing of the value of their craftsmanship! But we do...and we
- 20. have enough buried beneath this fort to own the world!

- 1. COLOMBO: "Let us keep your trinkets safe from bad men who would try to
- 2. make profit from such things," I said to them. And they hurried
- to collect as much as possible...(LAUGH) and to store it
- 4. beneath this fort!
- 5. RODREGAS: I have never seen so much gold in my life. I didn't know there
- 6. even was so much.
- 7. COLOMBO: And now it is ours!
- 8. THEY LAUGH
- 9. COLOMBO: My friend, your joviality supplants your manners. My glass is
- 10. empty.
- 11. RODREGAS: (LAUGHS) Your glass? | The bottle! BIG LAUGH
- 12. COLOMBO: Allow me to get another. No, on second thought ... why have we
- 13. all these servants running about the fort if not to use them.
- 14. RODREGAS: (SATISFIED SIGH) Ahhhhhhhh...pity our poor civilized brothers
- 15. back in Portugal. They must toil...we simply command. They
- 16. must fetch and carry...we simply command. They must exert
- 17. themselves...we simply live!
- 18. COLOMBO: (SHOUTS) Slave! Is there anyone out there!?
- 19. RODREGAS: (MUTTERS) Take your eyes off them for one minute and they are
- 20. off somewhere, sleeping.
- 21. COLOMBO: Ach! I shall see what they are about.

- 1. SOUND: CHAIR PUSHED BACK: STEPS ON STONE FLOOR TO DOOR: DOOR OPENED
- 2. COLOMBO: Strange. There doesn't seem to be anyone about ... anywhere.
- 3. RODREGAS: (MID) Oh?
- 4. SOUND: CHAIR PUSHED BACK MID AND STEPS FADE ON AND STOP: JUNGLE
- 5. BIRDS IN DISTANCE
- 6. RODREGAS: (AWED) Not a soul. Where are the slaves?
- 7. COLOMBO: More important...where are the troops? There is something very
- 8. unusual going on here.
- 9. RODREGAS: Parhaps we should look around.
- 10. COLOMBO: After we strap our swords to our sides, my friend.
- 11. RODREGAS: Si.
- 12. SOUND: THEY WALK A FEW STEPS: SOME CLANKING AS THEY GET SWORDS AND
- 13. STRAP THEM ON: THEN THEY WALK TO DOOR AND OUT: BIRDS UP A
- 14. BIT: THEY WALK SLOWLY ALONG STONE SURFACE
- 15. COLOMBO: (OVER ABOVE) I could understand the slaves trying to sit down
- 16. on their work...but the troops.
- 17. RODREGAS: I am ready. Let's look, and see if we can determine what is
- 18. going on.
- 19. COLOMBO: (AS THEY WALK ALONG OUTSIDE) (QUIETLY) It is as thought we are
- 20. the only one alive in the world.

- 1. RODREGAS: The celebrating of our good fortune has fired your imagination.
- 2. There is some rational explanation for this...this disappearance...
- of everyone.
- 4. COLOMBO: The fort seems somehow ... forsaken even by God.
- 5. RODREGAS: It has been forsaken by a thousand natives and three hundred
- 6. troops! We are here ... alone.
- 7. COLOMBO: But why?
- 8. RODREGAS: That I cannot answer, my friend. I
- 9. COLOMBO: What is it?
- 10. RODREGAS: My eyes ... they are playing tricks. I thought ... over there ...
- 11. I thought I saw one of our soldiers lying on the ground ... and
- 12. then somehow he slid around that corner. It is the unusualness
- 13. of the situation in which we find ourselves.
- 14. COLOMBO: But look! There in the dirt by that corner. There are the
- 15. marks left by his feet as he slid!
- 16. RODREGAS: No! It couldn't be!
- 17. COLOMBO: What? What is it, Rodregas?
- 18. RODREGAS: The natives! Our slaves...they have (VOCAL AS HE IS HIT BY
- 19. DART)
- 20. COLOMBO: What is it? Tell meil

- 1. RODREGAS: (IN GREAT PAIN) My...my side...hit.
- 2. COLOMBO: A dart! The kind the natives use!
- 3. RODREGAS: (VERY WEAK) Si...the kind they use ... on us!
- 4. SOUND: HE FALLS TO GROUND
- 5. COLOMBO: (FRIGHTENED) He's... (SHOUTS) Where are you? Why do not you
- 6. show yourselves?! Come out in the open that we may fight! I
- 7. am waiting! Is there none of you who would match swords with
- 8. me? Come out, I say!
- 9. SOUND: SUDDENLY THE WHOOP OF HUNDREDS OF NATIVES RISES AND TAKE SCENE
- 10. ORGAN: SWELL TO COVER SCENE AND THEN QUIET UNDER
- 11. BILL: Hello, boys and girls. As you've already heard, today's story
- 12. is on the unusual side. That's why I'm out here now to tell you
- 13. just a little about it. What you just heard was one of the
- 14. strange events of history that few people know anything about.
- 15. It happened down in South America way back in the 15th century
- 16. almost five-hundred years ago. Men of Portugal had established
- 17. a few forts along the great Amazon River, and were making slaves
- 18. of the natives...and taking their gold and craftsmanship to
- 19. sell. Then one day scenes very much like you just heard began
- 20. taking place. Many Portugese soldiers and citizens were
- 21. massacred and the natives just went back into the woods...

- 1. BILL: (CONTD.) leaving the old forts to become overgrown with weeds...
- 2. and forgotten. Forgotten until not too long ago when an old
- 3. friend of mine was flying over that area in his small plane.
- 4. ORGAN AND SOUND CROSS FADE UNDER LAST LINE ABOVE
- 5. SOUND: SMALL PLANE FLYING ALONG UNDER
- 6. AL: Ahhhhhhh. It sure will be good to get back to Georgetown.
- This has been a long trek.
- 8. GEORGE: Georgetown and home.
- 9. AL: That's right. You're due for a holiday soon, aren't you?
- 10. GEORGE: And no one needs it more than I do. They used to say that
- 11. Topographical engineers made more money and did less work than
- 12. anyone in the world. But now that everyone wants exacting
- 13. details for mapwork, well...
- 14. AL: You don't have to tell me.
- 15. GEORGE: It sure will be good to see the states again.
- 16. AL: Going back to that little town you always talk about ... uhhhh,
- 17. what's it's name?
- 18. GEORGE: Knotty Pine...and I sure am! I'm going back there...take off
- 19. my hat...and just relax for one solid month. I don't even want
- 20. to look at a map...or country...or anything. I'm just going to
- 21. see people.

- 1. AL: I envy you, George. I'm about due for a holiday myself, and I
- just got back from mine!
- 3. THEY CHUCKLE
- 4. GEORGE: How soon do you think we'll get to Georgetown?
- 5. AL: I don't know for certain. I'm taking this new way. I hope this
- 6. new way we're taking is faster. It means flying over a great
- 7. deal of unpopulated area.
- 8. GEORGE: Well, the plane is in good shape. Besides, if my eyes don't
- 9. deceive me, there are little villages all through that country
- 10. down there. I see a fire every now and then, and once in a
- 11. While a hut.
- 12. AL: That's all well and good, but I don't think I'd care to have to
- 13. land down there. No telling how civilized those native tribes
- 14. are.
- 15. GEORGE: I guess that's a point all right. Well, the sooner we get to ...
- 16. Hey!
- 17. AL: What is it?
- 18. GEORGE: Look down there. Do you see what I see?
- 19. AL: The Amazon River. (CHUCKLES) It puts your Mississippi to
- 20. shame.

- 1. GEORGE: No. I don't mean that. Look in a ways from it...about a mile.
- Do you see it...down there.
- 3. AL: (SURPRISED) I... I see it... but I have a little trouble
- 4. believing it. It looks like a fort, or something of the kind.
- 5. GEORGE: Let's go down there and get a better look.
- 6. AL: Hang on.
- 7. SOUND: PLANE SWOOPS DOWN AND LEVELS OFF
- 8. GEORGE: Here it comes.
- 9. AL: It is a fort! A bit run down, but none-the-less, a fort.
- 10. GEORGE: A huge thing! It must be hundreds of years old. Any idea
- 11. how it got there.
- 12. AL: None...unless...
- 13. GEORGE: Unless?
- 14. AL: Well, I'm not sure about this...but it seems to me I remember
- 15. reading somewhere that just about the time the North American
- 16. continent was being opened up, the Portugese were starting
- 17. operations down here in South America. Along the Amazon, if
- 18. I'm not mistaken.
- 19. GEORGE: That would make that fort somewhere around five hundred years
- 20. old.
- 21. AL: If she's a Portugese fort, I suppose it would.

- 1. GEORGE: Let's swing back around. I'd like to get some pictures of her.
- 2. AL: Well...all right. But this is probably making my short-cut
- 3. twice as long as the usual way!
- 4. SOUND: PLANE SWOOPS AGAIN
- 5. ORGAN: SWOOP ALONG WITH PLACE AND TRANSITION TO LIGHT MOOD
- 6. STUMPY: Well, it looks like fun t'me, Bill.
- 7. BILL: I think so, too, Old timer. It'll do us good to get into a
- 8. completely different part of the country.
- 9. STUMPY: I don't know how much of that deep sea fishin' I'd want to do,
- 10. but I know I wouldn't complain about soakin' up lots o' sun
- 11. on them beaches.
- 12. BILL: Then it's settled. This year, we spend our vacation in sunny
- 13. Florida.
- 14. STUMPY: Yipeee!!!
- 15. BILL: (CHUCKLES) I haven't seen you this excited about a vacation in
- 16. a long time, Stumpy.
- 17. STUMPY: I guess I'd better settle down a bit. You know that old saying ..
- 18. BILL: If I don't know that old saying, I have a feeling I'm about to
- 19. learn it.
- 20. STUMPY: The bigger the summer vacation, the harder the fall. (BIG

21. LAUGE)

- 1. SOUND: DOOR OPENS MID
- 2. GEORGE: (MID) I knew it! Things never change in this office!
- 3. BILL: Well, look who's here. George Welson!
- 4. GEORGE: (FADING ON) Just as I expected. Stumpy crackin' jokes and the
- 5. rest of you lookin' just a little pained. (LAUGHS) How are you,
- 6. Bill? Stumpy?
- 7. BILL: Fine ... fine. I hardly need to ask you. Look at you. You must
- 8. have gained fifty pounds since the last time you were in Knotty
- 9. Pine.
- 10. STUMPY: You're lookin' just swell, young feller.
- 11. GEORGE: Y'know, sometimes when I'm working down there in South America,
- 12. and I think back to my school days here in Knotty Pine, you guys
- 13. get to be a kind of legend to me. I get to wondering if you
- 14. really are here.
- 15. STUMPY: (CHUCKLES) Well, if'n you dreamed us up, young feller, we'd
- 16. like t'thank you. We've got to be pretty good friends.
- 17. ALL CHUCKLE
- 13. GEORGE: And you never change ... it's great to see you again.
- 19. BILL: And you, George. Sit down. I know you've got about five
- 20. years-worth of things to tell us. How's the map making
- 21. business these days?

1. ORGAN: LIGHT BRIDGE

- 2. GEORGE: (COMING OUT OF BRIDGE) And that about brings us up to this
- 3. moment. Whew! When you lay out everything I've been doing the
- 4. past years like that, I'm even a little impressed myself.

5. THEY CHUCKLE

- 6. STUMPY: Well, it sure sounds interestin'. Seein' all that country,
- 7. an' all.
- 8. GEORGE: Oh, after a while you think if you see another area from the
- 9. plane you'll go crazy. It all looks the same.
- 10. BILL: (CHUCKLES) I hope you don't draw up your maps to all look
- ll. alike.
- 12. GEORGE: Well, you know what I mean. The scenic attractions are few and
- 13. far between. It's mostly just trees and mountains. I'm just
- 14. glad to see people for once.
- 15. BILL: I'm sure you are.
- 16. GEORGE: Euh....
- 17. BILL: What's that?
- 18. GEORGE: Oh, a fleeting thought, Bill. We were talking about seeing
- 19. interesting things....and I thought of one really unusual sight
- 20. I saw on my last flight before I came back here.

- 1. BILL: What was it?
- 2. GEORGE: I've got some pictures of it, Bill. Really unusual. Right down
- 3. there in dense wooded country near the Amazon River, an old fort.
- 4. STUMPY: A fort?
- 5. GEORGE: That's right. From what I hear, the Portugese built the things
- there hundreds of years ago.
- 7. STUMPY: Is there anyone living' there now?
- 8. GEORGE: Not that I could tell. Here, let me show you the pictures.
- 9. SOUND: SLIGHT PAPER RATTLE
- 10. GEORGE: These were taken from the plane as we passed over it.
- 11. STUMPY: Would you look at that! Whooooooeeeee...looks almost haunted.
- 12. BILL: It certainly is over-run with weeds and shubbery.
- 13. GEORGE: That's what makes me think that no one is living there now.
- 14. Look in this picture here, Bill. I didn't notice it when I took
- 15. the shots, but see if this looks like anything to you. See?
- 16. Down in this corner.
- 17. BILL: Humanam...it almost looks like a skelton. Maybe my imagination
- 18. is a little excited by the looks of that fort.
- 19. GEORGE: I thought so too. And you know, there isn't a town within ten

- 1. GEORGE: (CONTD.) miles of that place in any direction ... not even a
- 2. native village. The whole place really intrigues me. I've
- 3. had time getting it off my mind ever since I saw it.
- 4. STUMPY: It does have that effect on a feller. I mean, it's even got me
- 5. wonderin' what's really there in all them old stones.
- 6. BILL: (CHUCKLES) I'll have to join the club. It'd be fun to explore
- 7. that old fort, wouldn't it?
- 8. PAUSE
- 9. STUMPY: (CLEARS HIS THROAT) Ubbbb, Bill ...
- 10. BILL: Yes, old Timer?
- 11. STUMPY: (OVERLY CASUAL) I was just a-thinkin' ... I don't really see where
- 12. sittin' on some beach down in Florida would be so much fun. I
- 13. get plenty of good sunshine all year out here.
- 14. BILL: (AGREEING) Uh huh...and I suppose I could put off deep sea
- 15. fishing for a while. I mean, after all...
- 16. GEORGE: (EXCITED) Say, do I mead you fellows right? Are you deciding to
- 17. go down to South America and find that old fort?
- 18. BILL: Our vacation rolls around in exactly three days, George.
- 19. GEORGE: And I'm on vacation right now.
- 20. STUMPY: Good! I was hopin' we'd have somebody who knew the country 21. down there.

- 1. GEORGE: (LAUGHS) There isn't anybody who knows the country around where
- 2. we're headed for. Is it settled? Are we going?
- 3. BILL: We're going to have to pack a little different kind of bag
- 4. than we planned. This looks like it'll be some vacation!
- 5. ORGAN: A LITTLE VACATION MUSIC, RALPH!
- 6. SOUND: FOREIGN MARKET PLACE B.G.
- 7. STUMPY: If'n that don't beat all! All these fellers standin' around
- 8. lookin' for work, but as soon as you tell 'em where you want
- 9. 'em to go with you, they run off!
- 10. GEORGE: It's strange, all right. I've never seen anything like it.
- 11. BILL: Are they against working for strangers or something?
- 12. GEORGE: Hardly. That's the way they make their living. I can't figure
- 13. out what the trouble is.
- 14. STUMPY: They seem to have something against that old fort we want to see.
- 15. GEORGE: I didn't think anyone had ever heard of it before I saw it from
- 16. the plane.
- 17. BILL: Well, it seems that ...
- 18. CASADEL: Pardon me. You gentlemen looking for fine guide and boy?
- 19. GEORGE: That's right. We are.

- 1. CASADEL: I Casadel. I fine guide and boy.
- 2. STUMPY: You may be both o'them, but your tune might come out a little
- 3. different when you hear where we want to go.
- 4. CASADEL: White-haired father hard to hear. Casadel not sing.
- 5. BILL: He means that you might not be so anxious to act as our guide
- 6. When you find out where it is we want to go.
- 7. CASADEL: Casadel know.
- 8. GEORGE: And you're still willing to go with us?
- 9. CASADEL: You have many gun?
- 10. GRORGE: Well...we have enough to go around.
- 11. CASADLE: Casadel go...go as far as legs will allow.
- 12. BILL: Casadel, what is this all about? Why is it that none of the
- 13. others will accompany us to the old Portugese fort?
- 14. CASADEL: It long story...passed down from fathers long ago. I tell you
- 15. Whole story on way. Maybe you want turn back when you hear.
- 16. GEORGE: If that's the case, why are you willing to go out with us at all?
- 17. CASADEL: (SMILES) That easy. You pay Casadel for time he give you.
- 18. ORGAN: LIGHT BRIDGE: THEN SUDDENLY OMINOUS

- 1. SOUND: CHUG OF BOAT MOTOR (LARGE ENOUGH BOAT THAT MOTOR IN ENCLOSED,
- 2. BUT BEAT ENOUGH THAT IT DOESNOT SOUND LIKE THE PORPOISE
- 3. GEORGE: We were fortunate to find this boat at such a reasonable price.
- 4. STUMPY: We can thank Casadel for it. He's a good man, all right.
- 5. BILL: He seems to know what he's doing.
- 6. STUMPY: When are we going to ask him to tell us about the fort?
- 7. GEORGE: I'm for doing it right away, but he seems to be putting off the
- 8. discussion. I think he wants to get a few days up the Amazon
- 9. before he tells us.
- 10. BILL: (CHUCKLES) So he'll get a few days' more pay, eh?
- 11. GEORGE: I think that's it.
- 12. STUMPY: He's an enterprizin' young feller. He seems pretty sure we'll
- 13. turn back when he tells us the story of the fort.
- 14. GEORGE: Y'know, it just occured to me...maybe the reason he's not
- 15. telling us about it is that there is no story. Maybe he's
- 16. making use of the time to think one up.
- 17. BILL: That's possible. But that wouldn't explain the fear that
- 18. everyone back in that village had of the place.
- 19. GEORGE: No... I guess not.

- 1. STUMPY: Well, I for one, am about t'bust if'n I don't find out soon.
- 2. Let's go back to where he's drivin' this here boat, and have it
- 3. out.
- 4. GEORGE: I'm about as anxious as anyone.
- 5. BILL: That makes three. Let's go.
- 6. SOUND: THEY WALK ALONG WOODEN SURFACE AND STOP ON CUE
- 7. CASADEL: Casadel see great question on face of three new friends.
- 8. BILL: That's exactly what you see, Casadel.
- 9. STUMPY: Got any idea what we're curious about?
- 10. CASADEL: (SMITES) You want Casadel to show begutiful scenery on
- 11. sides of river.
- 12. GEORGE: Guess again.
- 13. CASADEL: You want stop at small island ... talk with one who live
- 14. on island?
- 15. STUMPY: Awww, quit beatin' around the bush, Casadel! You know why
- 16. we're here and what we want to know.
- 17. CASADEL: White-haired father say hard things. Casadel guiding boat
- 18. up river. Not even near bushes.
- 19. GEORGE: He means stop giving us answers you know we don't want.

- 1. STUMPY: That's right. And while you're at it, you can drop that
- 2. white-haired father business.
- 3. CASADEL: Drop ...?
- 4. BILL: (GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS) Casadel, you know why everyone
- 5. back in your village was afraid to accompany us to the old
- 6. fort. You also expect us to turn back when we learn the
- 7. secret of the place.
- 8. GEORGE: We want to know what you know about that fort.
- 9. CASADEL: Casadel happy to tell you ...
- 10. STUMPY: That's more like it.
- 11. CASADEL: ...later.
- 12. BILL: I'm afraid that won't do, Casadel. We want to know now.
- 13. PAUSE
- 14. CASADEL: (SIGH) So... Casadel tell. But this mean less pay and
- 15. Casadel very poor man...very poor.
- 16. GEORGE: Casadel might be a very rich man if he tells us, and we
- 17. still go on to the fort. The whole trip will take over
- 18. a week.
- 19. CASADEL: No...no chance. Not even fiercest tribes of back country go
- 20. MEET to old fort. Spirits keep them away.

- 1. BILL: Spirits?
- 2. CASADEL: This is story...

3. ORGAN: CREEP UNDER WITH EERIE ACCOMPANIMENT TO CASADEL'S TALE

4. (NO BRIDGE)

Many years ago...long before Casadel or any of oldest people 5. CASADEL: 6. Casadel know, there live white man from across sea in old fort. 7. He very bad to my people. He make them work for him for no pay. He take everything they have. He beat them. He take 8. much gold and things from them and hide it away for him in 9. fort. One day my people tire of serving...tire of beatings.... 10. tire of having nothing for selves. They kill all white men 11. 12. in fort and go back into forests. But white man very bad ... 13. his spirit still live in old fort. He still keep gold for self. He still beat and kill anyone who come near to fort. That why 14. 15. everyone in village afraid to go to fort. And that why Casadel now turn boat around and go back to village. 16.

17. ORGAN: PUNCTUATE AND OUT (KEEP SOUND)

- 18. GEORGE: Wait a minute, Casadel. Don't turn back. Not yet.
- 19. CASADEL: But now you know story.
- 20. STUMPY: That's right. Now we know the story, but so far I ain't heard 21. any reason t'stay away from the fort.

- 1. GEORGE: Neither have I.
- 2. CASADEL: (GETTING FRIGHTENED) But...spirit...guarding gold. Even
- bravest warrior of fiergest tribe not go to old fort.
- 4. BILL: That may be true, Casadel. But that's because they fear
- 5. some old Portugese ghosts. We don't fear such things because
- 6. we know they don't exist.
- 7. CASADEL: You not be sure. Casadel hear many strange things.
- 8. BILL: That may be true, Casadel. But we know that there is only
- 9. one true Spirit. And there is nothing greater than the one
- 10. true Spirit.
- 11. CASADEL: (LAUGHS) You talk like teacher in my village. He say,
- 12. "There only one Spirit." And other times he say, "There
- 13. no such things as spirits."
- 14. GEORGE: Teacher?
- 15. CASADEL: White teacher. He come from your country. I learn your
- 16. Language from him. He tell us of man named Jesus who die
- 17. and send His good Spirit to us. (THEN) But old fort
- 18. guarded by spirits of bad men! They not like anyone come

- 19. near! They kill anyone who come near!
- 20. BILL: Casadel, how do you know about these bad spirits?

- 1. CASADEL: Casadel know from father, and from father of father. All

 2. my people know old fort.
- GEORGE: I've been down here for almost five years. I never heard
 of it before.
- 5. CASADEL: That because no one talk of fort. No one go near fort...
 6. no one live near fort...no one talk of fort.
- 7. STUMPY: Well, it all sounds pretty fantastic to me. Bad spirits and all.
- 9. GEORGE: Don't forget, Stumpy, we haven't been raised in the same

 10. way Casadel has. To him spirits are as commonplace as cars

 11. are to us.
- 12. CASADEL: You not believe in spirits?
- 13. STUMPY: Nope.
- 14. CASADEL: But you just say something of one spirit
- 15. BILL: You see, Casadel, we believe in the <u>one</u> Spirit who has power lower all other spirits. He is the Spirit of the great God who made all the earth.
- 18. CASADEL: That what teacher tell us.
- 19. GEORGE: Well, your teacher has told you rightly, Casadel. And God's

 20. Spirit is not like an evil spirit. He comes to help us, and to

- 1. GEORGE: (CONTD.) teach us of God, and His Son Jesus Christ.
- 2. CASADEL: Teacher tell us that Jesus killed for all world, but Casadel
- 3. not understand.
- 4. STUMPY: That oughtn't to be too hard to follow, sonny. Look at 'er
- 5. this way. Let's say we was all taken captive by a bunch of
- 6. hungry cannibals down here.
- 7. CASADEL: Casadel not think of that.
- 8. STUMPY: Just for the sake of showin' you an idea of what Jesus'
- 9. dyin' for us means. Now, let's say that Bill, here, stepped out
- 10. and said to the chief, "If you let all these other fellers go,
- 11. I'll let you do whatever you want to me."
- 12. CASADEL: That brave thing.
- 13. GEORGE: Well, in a way, that's just what Jesus did for us, Casadel.
- 14. God wants us to be good people...loving and serving Him.
- 15. But we aren't, and He has to punish the way we are.
- 16. CASADEL: Casadel not very bad boy. Even teacher says that.
- 17. BILL: (SMILES) I'm sure that's true. But maybe this will help you
- 18. see what the trouble is. How many strokes does a man have to
- 19. take in the river before he is a swimmer?

- 1. CASADEL: (LAUGHS) He only need to fall in water for that!
- 2. BILL: And it is the same way with us. We only need to fall into one
- 3. sin to be a sinner. And that means that God must punish us.
- 4. CASADEL: But that mean Casadel have much punishment waiting him.
- 5. GEORGE: And now we are back to Jesus dying for us. He has taken that
- 6. punishment, Casadel. He has made things right with God by
- 7. taking the punishment we deserve.
- 8. CASADEL: (TROUBLED) That hard to understand. Why anyone do that?
- 9. BILL: God saw us all getting farther and farther away from Him, and
- 10. knew that man in himself was too weak to come back. So He did
- 11. for us what we couldn't do for ourselves, Casadel. He took our
- 12. punishment on Himself.
- 13. STUMPY: And because He fixed things up for us...and then sent His great
- 14. Spirit to us for help to understand Himself and help in bein'
- 15. What He wants us to be ... well, it'd be pretty silly of us to be
- 16. scared of a few so-called evil spirits...which aren't even there:
- 17. CASADEL: But how you say Jesus send His spirit, but men in past times
- 18. not send their spirits?
- 19. GEORGE: This Jesus was no ordinary man, Casadel. He was God's Son, and
- 20. the Spirit He sent was God's Spirit. We men. ..well, as far as we
- 21. know, we can't just send our spirits floating around places.
- 22. When we die, our business is with God...just as it is while we
- 23. are alive.

- 1. CASADEL: (HESITANTLY) That clear...but still hard to understand.
- 2. BILL: Maybe we'll be able to talk more about it while we explore the
- 3. old fort.
- 4. CASADEL: Then...you....still go there?
- 5. STUMPY, BILL, GEORGE: AD LIB YES
- 6. PAUSE
- 7. CASADEL: (PULLING TOGETHER ALL HIS COURAGE) Well.... Casadel offer to
- 8. take you...so...Casadel take you.
- 9. GEORGE: Good man!
- 10. STUMPY: That's the spirit ... I mean
- 11. BILL: We're glad you'll stay with us, Casadel.
- 12. CASADEL: It long trip up river. Maybe three ... four day.
- 13. STUMPY: In that case ... (YAWN) ... I think I'll get a little vacationin'
- 14. in. I've got a feelin' that when we reach the old fort, we
- 15. ain't goin' t'have too much time to relax.
- 16. ORGAN: TRAVEL BRIDGE SLOWLY CHANGING TO OMINOUS AND UNDER
- 17. SOUND: BOAT MOTORS ALONG UNDER
- 18. GEORGE: (OFF MIKE) (SEOUTS) Okay, Casadel! Cut motor!

- 1. SOUND: MOTOR CUTS AND BOAT GLIDES THROUGH WATER FINALLY SCRAPING ON
- 2. SAND AND COMING TO A STOP: JUNGLE BIRDS B.G.
- 3. STUMPY: Huh...almost looks like this bank of the river was made to
- 4. dock a boat on.
- 5. BILL: It probably was ... a long time ago. It's kept the same general
- 6. contour.
- 7. GEORGE: (FADING ON) Now, as mear as I can figure, the old fort ought to
- 8. be approximately one mile straight south from this point.
- 9. BILL: (CHUCKLES) Well, if a map maker is sure...so am I. Let's set
- 10. out.
- 11. CASADEL: (FADES ON) (FRIGHTENED) You sure you want to go to fort?
- 12. Casadel sure it not good idea.
- 13. STUMPY: Now, take it easy, sonny. You just stick with us and
- 14. everything'll be all right.
- 15. CASADEL: But signs along bank. They tell of danger.
- 16. GEORGE: Signs?
- 17. CASADEL: See? There ... and over there.
- 18. STUMPY: Are you talkin' about them pretty red flowers along the bank?

- 1. CASADEL: They not flowers, White-haired father. They warnings. Red
- 2. cotton ball mean death to one who go farther.
- 3. BILL: Who put those warnings there, Casadel?
- 4. CASADEL: Nearby tribes. They come no nearerto fort than river, and put
- 5. up cotton ball warnings along bank.
- 6. BILL: Y'know, George, this little excursion gets more interesting by
- 7. the hour. Legends, ghosts...even treasure. I'm really getting
- 8. anxious to look that old fort over.
- 9. GRORGE: I was thinking the same thing. Let's go.
- 10. ORGAN: UP TO COVER AND OMINOUS BRIDGE
- 11. SOURD: JUNGLE BIRDS B.G.: MEN TRUDGE THROUGH BUSHES
- 12. GEORGE: It shouldn't be too far ahead now.
- 13. STUMPY: How are you making out, Casadel?
- 14. CASADEL: Casadel's legs very wobbly, but able to walk.
- 15. BILL: We'll be sitting down soon, Casadel. I'm sure there are
- 16. benches and things like that inside the fort.
- 17. CASADEL: Casadel not sure he want to sit down once we there. Might sit
- 18. in.... (SHREEK OF FEAR)
- 19. SOUND: MEN STOP WALKING

- 1. GEORGE: What's the matter?
- 2. CASADEL: L-1-loook! Under bush over there! A hand!
- 3. STUMPY: Great horney toads!
- 4. GEORGE: Looks like the whole skeleton is under there.
- 5. SOUND: __ PUSHING OF BUSHES AROUND A BIT
- 6. BILL: That's what it is, all right. And I'd say by the looks of it,
- that it's been out here a long time.
- 8. CASADEL: We turn back now?
- 9. BILL: I don't see why? This might be one of those Portugese soldiers
- 10. Who was massacred when the slaves rebelled.
- 11. GEORGE: You think that skelton is that old, Bill?
- 12. BILL: I don't know for certain. But I don't see any reason why we
- 13. should turn back.
- 14. GEORGE: Meither do I. Let's keep going.
- 15. STUMPY: Say...we bean lookin' at the ground too much, fellers. Look
- 16. up ahead.
- 17. ORGAN: SMALL FAN FARE AND UNDER (NOT A BRIDGE)
- 18. GEORGE: It's the old fort!

1. BILL: Look at the size of it. I had no idea it was so large.

2. CASADEL: (VOICE OF DOOM) Big fort ... hold many evil spirits. Soon we

all look like man of bones here.

4. ORGAN: UP WITH OMINOUS BRIDGE

5. BILL: Looks like our time is about up this week, boys and girls.

6. And I know you'll want to join us next time to see what happens

7. when we actually explore the old fort. But that'll have to

wait till next week when we join you for more adventure with ...
